Your Journey To The Summit.

Majestic Mount Snowdon dominates the glorious, ancient landscape of North Wales. At 3,560ft (1,085m) it is a true mountain and a place of legend – said to be the burial place of the giant ogre Rhita, vanquished by King Arthur. Some believe that Arthur's knights still sleep beneath. In a tremendously ambitious feat of engineering, and uniquely in Britain, a rack and pinion railway was built which rises to within 66ft of the summit of the highest mountain in England and Wales.

Truly Magnificent Views to Take Your Breath Away.

On fine days the views from the train, as you are carried along the spectacular ridge to the summit, are truly breathtaking. You will have one of the world's great panoramas at your feet!

Clogwyn Station at 2,556ft (779m) is as high as trains go when adverse weather prevents an assault on the Summit. But the view looking down on the Llanberis Pass is no less spectacular.




Beyond the waterfall the train emerges into open, treeless countryside and can give you a first glimpse of the sharp peak of Snowdon.

Your journey begins at Llanberis Station. The only part of the track that is flat. From here to the Summit, the locomotives push hard with an average gradient of 12.6% (1 in 8).

Shortly after starting your journey through this magical land the train crosses two viaducts. The 14 arches of the Lower Viaduct and the four spans of the Upper Viaduct.

During your 30 minute stay at the peak, you can simply savour the views or make use of the summit facilities. Your train begins its descent, arriving back at Llanberis 2½ hours after your journey began.

This area is called the Valley of Rocks with its massive boulders worn down by weather and shattered by frosts. Beyond halfway rises the black, volcanic face of Clogwyn du'r Arddu.
